Margo Perkins opened the meeting at 2:03 p.m. which took place online, using Zoom.

#### I. Curriculum Reports — Margo Perkins, Anthony Ayerza & Janet Sloan

Margo Perkins stated there were no new courses or additional sites/sections of existing courses this month. There are UC a-g submission changes, effective in 2022. Previously, there were 3 different submission cycles. In 2022, February 1-June 30 will be the newly extended Phase 1 for submissions. From July 1-31, there will be a Course Management Phase which doesn't allow any submissions during that period. Finally, the Supplemental Phase runs from August 1-31 and is only for new submissions. ### II. Finance/Legislation/Other — Janet Sloan

Janet Sloan began by discussing the current legislative outlook which appears good for the next 2 years and includes a potential COLA of 5.3%. One area of concern is being referred to as a "fiscal cliff" in 2023-24. This is a result of the temporary ADA caps put into effect in 2020, due to Covid-19 and the Stay At Home orders. One possible solution is putting a 3-year rolling average in place to minimize the drop in attendance statewide. Student behavioral health issues are also becoming a priority issue and additional legislation could address this concern. Prop 98 is continuing to increase revenues, with an expected amount of \$10-12 billion and growth over the next 3 years.

Janet covered reports from CDE, including CTEIG funds for 2021-22 (which were applied for last June). Submissions will be going to the Board in January. The amounts awarded for CTEIG should be posted on December 29, 2021, in conjunction with the Board's agenda for their January meeting. Funds would not need to be spent until December 2023. However, each district's own match must be spent by June 30, 2022. Because of the additional \$150 million in CTE funding legislated in July, there is now \$300 million available for CTEIG—which is double the normal amount. So, at the minimum, each district in our consortium should receive their requested amount—which has never happened for our group. There is potential for additional funding over the requested amount, based on our match amount submitted. Janet will email districts with their funding amounts, once she has reviewed the state's post on December 29.

Next, Janet discussed CTEIG reporting. An email was sent to District Coordinators regarding two upcoming webinars on December 7 & 9, 2021, which will cover each district's data reporting responsibilities and processes. Our upcoming Follow-up Study, beginning January 10, will provide the data districts need to upload under this requirement.

An audit of the K12 Strong Workforce program was conducted by the Joint Legislative Audit Committee (JLAC). The results will not be made public until either January or February. At that point, depending on what the findings are, some additional legislation may take place to make sure everything is in alignment with the audit. There's also a rumor about consolidating the funds from CTEIG and K12 Strong Workforce, and possibly making it categorical funding again which wouldn't be ideal.

Also discussed were CAROCP priorities for 2022, which includes promoting the many success stories of our students. This is important information our legislators need to know, so they are aware of importance of the legislation affecting our programs.

Teresa Schneider reminded districts to submit their invoices for last fiscal year, in order to close out the previous year and move forward with the current fiscal year. Please keep in mind any capital outlay purchases are taking 3-6 months to receive the requested items.

### III. K12 SWP Pathway Coordinators — Kenny Lopez/Michelle Wong

Michelle Wong and Kenny Lopez shared a presentation describing their roles as Pathway Coordinators and their efforts in supporting K-12 LEAs and Community Colleges to engage, collaborate and bridge the communications gap for CTE. The Pathway Coordinators have Labor Market Data Reports available for our districts either by pathway or course, depending on the data found. A January inservice is being scheduled, in cooperation with Fresno State, to assist districts with the Uni-Track process and discuss dual enrollment and early college credit. ### IV. Advisory Committee Meetings — Mike McColm

Mike McColm began by reminding District Coordinators that fall advisory meeting minutes and sign-in sheets are due December 17, 2021. Also, Noli Award nominations for the spring Advisory Night event are due January 10, 2022. Voting will take place during the January 13 District Coordinators meeting. Nomination guidelines will be sent out, following today's meeting. Please be sure to share this information with your instructors. Advisory Night will take place at Clovis North High School on April 26, 2022 with the theme: "In It To Win It." The registration link will be available soon on the Attendance website.

### V. <u>Career Tech Expo — Anthony Ayerza</u>

Anthony Ayerza announced the next Career Tech Expo will take place March 16, 2022 at Veterans Memorial Stadium in Clovis (next to Buchanan High School). More details will be shared soon.

### VI. <u>ROP Skills Challenge – Anthony Ayerza</u>

Anthony Ayerza stated vaccination requirements at Fresno City College would make it difficult to offer the ROP Skills Challenge event on their campus. So, an alternative version of the event will take place at multiple host sites on various dates, as well as online for some competitions. More specific information will be available soon.

### VII. Other

Margo Perkins pointed out next month's District Coordinators meeting will take place Thursday, January 13, 2022.
